DRIVERS FOR CHANGE IN LABORATORY MEDICINE

Globalisation:

- Laboratory medicine is becoming increasingly global thanks to instant communication and the influence of global organisations and companies.
- This has led to an appreciation of the need for a common approach to quality standards and clinical applications to meet expectations of patients, clinicians and other health stakeholders.

Technological Advance:

- Technological advance continues to impact on the organisation and delivery of laboratory medicine.
- Recent examples include the technological revolution in genomics, informatics and nanotechnology.

Economies of Scale:

- Healthcare budgets are under pressure across the world as we struggle to cope with an ageing population, medical advances and a rapidly rising workload.
- Laboratory medicine has shown itself to be flexible by improving efficiency, sharing technology and adopting common practices.

Integrated Diagnostics:

- Technological advance and economies of scale are eroding the traditional boundaries between laboratory medicine disciplines.
- The advent of patient choice, personalised medicine and new technology are creating an integrated approach to diagnostics.

Adding Value to Improve Patient Outcomes:

- All of the above factors highlight the need for experts who can organise services and interpret increasingly complex data.
- Laboratory medicine specialists must add value in order to convert data into knowledge to improve patient outcomes.

THE IFCC RESPONSE TO CHANGE

IFCC Must Embrace Change:

- The Executive Board believes the changing world of laboratory medicine offers critical opportunities that cannot be ignored.
- It believes that IFCC needs to improve its responsiveness and be more inclusive.

Opportunities for IFCC:

- A more inclusive IFCC will:
 - Have greater global influence with the World Health Organisation, United Nations and other global organisations.
 - Expand its role in setting quality and practice standards that will improve patient safety and clinical outcomes.
 - Increase its credibility with global clinical organisations in demonstrating the clinical value of laboratory medicine.
 - Develop a compelling ‘single voice’ for laboratory medicine.
 - Expand the number and range of projects as well as increase collaboration with appropriate projects to involve more experts from more countries.
 - Improve the quality of services and support to its Members and its affiliated Regional Federations.
 - Offer economies of scale to its Full and Corporate Members.
 - Avoid accusations of discrimination and restrictive practice.

Proposed Change:

- IFCC proposes to open its membership to any properly constituted society or company that works in laboratory medicine.
- New members would be welcome from any branch of laboratory medicine and from informatics and pharmaceutical companies.
- IFCC proposes to remove the current restriction on one Full Member per country, so eliminating the need for Affiliate Members.
- There are implications of this proposed change for the IFCC statutes. These will be debated at the next IFCC Council.
- IFCC also proposes to update its image and branding to better depict its role as a global leader in laboratory medicine.

An Invitation to the IFCC Council:

- All IFCC Members are invited to participate in a debate, which will take place at the IFCC Council meeting in Istanbul in June 2014.
- An electronic vote on changing the membership criteria will take place shortly after the Council debate.
- If a change in membership criteria is approved it will come into effect in January 2015.
- New rules would need to be implemented to ensure appropriate representation.

An Opportunity to Shape the Future:

- This is an exciting and important time for laboratory medicine and its contribution to healthcare.
- Therefore, it is the right time for IFCC to consider its future leadership role.
- Everyone who cares about IFCC has a chance to express his/her opinion and to influence the vote on membership that will take place after the Council meeting in 2014.
